What is the Project?

This project is an exploration of the violation of human rights with specific reference to the labour camps of World War 2 and the treatment of refugees in Europe in the last 60 years. The project will create a performance piece both to take and perform in Poland. This performance will evolve with the trip and the final piece will be shown at a conference to held in November around hate and understanding. The objective of the project is to develop young peoples awareness of the historical significance of the subject and how it relates to the situation in Europe today.

We aim to use the project to create young leaders in our communities who are informed of the consequences of prejudice and discrimination and who can use their learning to be a positive role model to others

This project will involve workshops that will take place before and after the visit to Poland in January and the group will present their work at Oldham Holocaust Memorial Day Event at the end of January 2016. In applying for this project you are committing to take part in the workshops, the trip to Poland and the conference event should you be successful in your application.
