What We've Been Doing

Meeting: 11th of January 2023

Youth councillors were welcomed back after the break, and was given training on speech writing and delivery, which helps in both internal elections alongside other elements such as motions to Oldham Council.

Additionally, youth councillors debated on the MYP terms, where most youth councillors agreed that Oldham should elect 2 MYPs and 2 DMYPs, with terms lasting **2 years** from 2023/24.

Meeting: 25th of January 2023

Youth councillors provided advice on the Oldham Participation Framework for Children and Young People. This is a document that is given to organisations in Oldham working with young people, and how participation run.

Alongside this, a proposal was made to deliver a motion to Oldham Council, likely in July 2023, discussing implementing in-house translation services in Oldham Council. This is especially important to break the language barrier. Most youth councillors favoured this.


