What We've Been Doing

Downing Street: 14th of June 2023

Vice-chair Penelope Spencer-Simpson and Children in Care Council Representative Precious, travelled to London to meet with the Children's Commissioner from the Department of Education, following their motion to make care-experience a protected characteristic in March 2023.

It enabled them to engage with the national campaign in discussions with policy makers, including, delivering a petition at No.10 Downing Street to support the

policy.

This meeting we discussed the Annual Conference by UK Youth Parliament (UKYP) with the Members of Youth Parliament (MYP); resulting in the key solution is to provide free sanitary products in all schools.

Discussion of the Mental Health Campaign called "Corners of the Mind" aimed at Year 11-13 students to highlight different ways to deal with exam stress. This categorises into 4 key sections: social, mindful, creative & physical.

YouthForia: 9th of September 2023

This month's Youthforia focused on the theme of 'Mental Health'. This enabled young people across the North West a place to come together and identify alternative ways to relieve stress and anxieties in their lives. These activities included dodgeball, dance, quizzes and workshops directly lead by Youth Councils.

It allowed young people to network and discuss the key issues and stigmas around mental health; this supported ideas for our mental health campaign occurring in February/March.

What We'll Be Up To

Campaign on Mental Health

'Corners of the Mind' will be an experience offered to young people about to sit key exams (i.e. GCSEs & A-Levels) with alternative ways to relieve stress in their day-to-day lives.

The experience will be split into 4 sections: Social, Creative, Mindful & Physical to provide a variety of activities that would help release stress on young people in the February/March.

Campaign on Smoking and Vaping

On the 12th of July, we submitted a motion asking for Oldham Council to request the government to ban disposable vapes.

2 months later on the 11th of September, a ban was announced.

This is good since disposable vapes cause issues, such as the plastic and batteries not being recycled, alongside the potential issue of it being worse than cigarettes. This is beneficial for both our health and our environment.

Please note that reusable vapes aren't banned.
